



Music Starter (Book Presentation): A New Method of Learning How to Read Music

Music Starter has been described as "A first-rate music tool that would greatly enhance the way we approach beginners' music instruction" (Dr. Dorian Leljak, WPTA President), "A wonderfully unique book with all the elements to ultimately instill a lifelong love of music!" (Dr. Maria Kotitsa, C Psychol, Regent's College, London, UK), "One of the nicest and most significant achievements of our piano pedagogy" (Rita Kinka, Academy of Arts, Novi Sad). The book is designed to help children learn basic symbols of music notation through playing games (including stickers, cards, a board game, etc.), solving logic problems, reading stories, etc. It encourages children to *discover* the meaning of each symbol of music notation, enabling them to acquire elemental music literacy in a meaningful, creative, and exciting way. The tasks are carefully organized so that a child gradually moves from what is known to him/her towards the unknown. Mechanical repetition is avoided since each task in a lesson in unique, which helps children gain a more profound understanding of the concepts presented, while maintaining their concentration levels and interest in the book. With each problem solved and game finished, children take one step closer to understanding the essential music parameters and their symbols (rhythm, meter, pitch, registers, etc.).

Strategies for Preparing Students to Face Different Performance Settings Implementing basic principles of the Lister-Sink Method



Feelings of anxiety, fear, confidence, acceptance, and happiness can have an important effect on a musician's performance. The processing of these inevitable emotions associated with a performance career can have a huge impact on musicians, especially in the developmental stages of their career. At different stages of professional and musical development, students will experience evaluative settings such as festivals, competitions, auditions, entrance exams, and recordings. If students are not emotionally well-prepared for these various performance opportunities, they can suffer from memory issues, lack of physiological control, and performance anxiety. As performing artists, it can seem like a rite of passage to experience both positive and the negative aspects of performance experience. Many students, however, are never taught how to cope in different performance scenarios as they progress into more advanced literature. Teachers can better emotionally and mentally prepare students for these sequenced stages of performing by specifically addressing each performing stage in an appropriate way. The purpose of this presentation is to give teachers an overview of the different strategies that can help prepare students for specific performance settings using the Lister-Sink method from a casual studio recital to an advanced-level competition.

Kristi Baker-Lampe holds a Bachelor of Music Education degree and a Master of Music degree in Piano Performance and Pedagogy from Kansas State University and a Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Piano Performance from the University of Kansas. She owns and operates KBL Piano Studio in Topeka, Kansas and serves as Music Director and Choirmaster at St. David's Episcopal Church. Prior to returning to her native Topeka, she served for five years as Adjunct Professor of Applied Piano at Ottawa (Kansas) University, and enjoyed a successful thirty-two year career as a public school music educator. She is Immediate Past President of the Kansas Music Teachers' Association. In 2009, the Music Teachers' National Association recognized her as a Nationally Certified Teacher of Music in Piano, a distinction she still holds. Dr. Baker-Lampe travels extensively giving public concerts and lectures, as well as teacher workshops and master classes. She has appeared throughout the United States and Europe as a singer, conductor, and pianist. Serbian-born pianist Ana Bursać graduated with distinction from the Royal College of Music, in the class of professor Dina Parakhina. For her Bachelor studies at the RCM, Ana was awarded a full scholarship being kindly supported by Sir Simon and Lady Virginia Robertson, followed by a Steinway Award. She gave performances in Serbia, Italy, Austria, Germany, France and the United Kingdom. She won prizes at renowned international competitions including First and Special Prize at the International Young Pianist Competition in Šabac, First Prize at the State Competition (Belgrade), First Prize at Davorin Jenko International Piano Competition and Third Prize at the Flame International Piano Competition. In the UK Ana appeared as a soloist at Steinway Hall, St. Martin-in-the-Fields, Amaryllis Fleming Concert Hall, Pallant House Gallery, Battersea Place, Charlton House, Austrian Cultural Forum, Pushkin House and Holy Trinity Church in Stratford-upon-Avon. Pianist Meiling Chen, born in Xiamen, China began her rapid development in her piano studies under the guidance of Meiging Zhang and Xiaoyan Lin in Xiamen Music High School, and continued with her pursuit of Bachelor Degree in Piano Performance at the Tianjin Conservatory of Music on Scholarship studying with Prof. Jingjing Wang. Furthermore, a prize winner of the Tianjin Piano competition, Miss. Chen was voted as well as the top ranked pianist at the Tianjin Conservatory of Music. This culminating stage in her studies lead Miss. Chen to pursuit her Master Degree in Piano Performance at Steinhardt NYU under the guidance of Prof. Eduardus Halim, Sascha Gorodnitzki Chair in Piano Studies at Steinhardt NYU and the sat protege of the legendary pianist, Vladimir Horowitz. Distinctive personality and strong musical temperament lead her to representing the city of Xiamen in concerts honouring the Chinese Presidents, Hu Jintao and Jiang Zemin as well as the Chiese Premier, Zhu Rongji. Further honour was the performance representing the city of Xiamen in Celebration of the Beijing Olympic. In addition, while attending the Tianjin Conservatory, Meiling Chen has appeared in numerous solo and duo concerts. In summer 2019, Miss. Isidor Bajić Music School (Novi Sad)



Ivan Chernukhin is a 5th year student of "Isidor Bajic" music school in Novi Sad, Professor Olga Borzenko's piano class. He was born in 2008 in Ternopil (Ukraine). His musical talent was noticed at a very young age, when he demonstrated a perfect pitch, giving him an uncanny ability to hear music in every ambient sound. During his early childhood Ivan has been exposed to classical music which invoked a huge interest in performing. In 2014 Ivan moved to Serbia with his family where later he started taking piano lessons at the age of 7. Two years later he started studying piano in "Isidor Bajic" music school in Novi Sad under Olga Borzenko. He won his first prize in the International competition in the same year. Ivan achieved excellent results in many competitions in Serbia, including Republic competitions and a well known festival "Isidor Bajić"; several competitions abroad including Young Pianists Carl Maria von Weber in Dresden, Germany, 14th Ars Nova International Music Competition, Trieste, Italy. In addition, Ivan participated in Guinness World Record setting among 23 young people playing grand piano simultaneously. He received multiple Laureate awards in international competitions both in Serbia and abroad. Among them are I. International creative olympiade Yekaterinburg - Dusseldorf, XVIII Davorin Jenko International Competition, the

Piano Competition "Slavenski" and VII Slobomir International Music Competition, etc. Ivan is a 4 times Laureate of the Republic competitions.





Dr. Crecca has been praised for her "distinctive voice" at the piano (The Chautauquan Daily). She holds a Doctor of Musical Arts in Piano Performance and Literature from the Eastman School of Music, a Master of Music in Piano Performance from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, and a Bachelor of Music in Piano Performance and Music Theory from the University of Michigan. Her past piano teachers include Natalya Antonova, Yoshikazu Nagai, and Logan Skelton. She studied harpsichord and fortepiano with Corey Jamason and Lisa Crawford. Prior to teaching at Bradley, Dr. Crecca held an assistantship in Applied Piano at Eastman, where she was nominated for the Teaching Assistant Prize for Excellence in Teaching.

Performance Practice in the Piano Music of Béla Bartók: Exploring Compositional Source Material and Historical Recordings

This lecture recital examines performing tendencies in rural Hungarian folksong and Bartók's own playing, as well as implications for modern interpretation. The inclusion of folk idioms in Bartók's music goes beyond the notes on the page; it is also an important component of performance style. The Hungarian folk influences are worth


examining, as they can provide us with greater insight into Bartók's music, as well as inspire a larger expressive vocabulary for playing it. Bartók's recordings of his own piano works reveal that his choices of rhythm, rubato, and inflection are related to his categories of folk music, and to the delivery style of folk songs in field recordings. To allow for specificity, the lecture will focus specifically on rural Hungarian vocal sources, and the implications for Bartók's repertoire that quotes or imitates them. Performance trends will be explained by placing Bartók's pianistic style within the context of his time and by giving an overview of Hungarian folk music characteristics. Demonstrations of how a modern pianist might approach playing Bartók's music will involve performances of selections from the 15 Hungarian Peasant Songs, Petit Suite, For Children, and Improvisations on Hungarian Peasant Songs.

I, Ratko Delorko, discovered the piano as my favourite toy at the tender age of three. It took me another three years to discover the piano as a creative tool for writing my youthful compositions. My professional background-my formative years-were shaped by studying piano, composition and conducting in Cologne, Düsseldorf and Munich. I have had the privilege of performing in such varied venues as the Berlin Philharmonie, the Tonhalle in Düsseldorf, the Cologne Philharmonie, the Gasteig in Munich, the Philharmonie in Essen, Hamburg's Musikhalle, the Glocke in Bremen, London's St. Martin in the Fields, Paleau de la Musica in Valencia, Beijing's Concert Hall, Shanghai's Oriental Arts Center, Cairo Opera House and others. Music for solo piano, piano duet, chamber music, electronic music, opera and ballet are fields in which my primary efforts are concentrated as a composer. Currently, I lecture at the Frankfurt University of Music. I have conducted master classes and served as guest professor in Malaysia, Russia, Italy, Croatia, Austria, the US, Vietnam and China, and I continue to do so to the present day. My book on the piano has been published by "Staccato-Verlag,". I recorded about 30 albums and my new book "The Nuts and Bolts of Online Piano Teaching" is to be released.

From the Perspective of the Composer

Composers take great pains to make their work as comprehensible as possible through precise indications of playing, phrasing and articulation. I hear your objection: With Bach there is nothing in it. Correct. Music was passed on interfamilially and from teacher to learner personally. Since the set of rules was known, there was no need for much notation, unless one deliberately deviated from the rule. Couperin, on the other hand, was able to push the accuracy of notation to the point of difficult legibility (Les Baricades mistérieuses). As soon as music became even rudimentarily commercialized, while the musical tastes of the time changed and the baroque set of rules became obsolete, notation inevitably had to become more and more precise. Third parties without personal instruction had to be able to cope with the material and achieve a usable result. How to create an authentic performance on a modern piano from that?

DUO PETROF - ANATOLY ZATIN & VLADA VASSILIEVA (MEXICO)

Universidad de Colima (Colima, Col., Mexico) WPTA Piano Duo, Presidents



After performing together for almost two decades years, Mexican pianists of Russian origin Anatoly Zatin and Vlada Vassilieva have developed their own concept of the piano duo as stage genre by creating and performing their own arrangements. Their many awards in the world of classical music include the first prize at the international competition for professional piano duos in the United States (2018), a nomination for the 2016 Hollywood Music in Media Awards for their iconic two piano version of El Jarabe Tapatío, and the title of Contemporary-Classical ensemble of the year by the 2016 Mexican Music Awards in New York City. Three of their albums have received Silver Medal at the Global Music Awards. Their recordings on Columna Musica and PlayAudio are available on many digital platforms. Duo Petrof (founded in 2003) is an ensemble in residence at the University of Colima in Mexico, where both pianists also teach. Anatoly Zatin graduated as composer, pianist and conductor from the Leningrad Conservatory of Music; he is winner of



international music competitions and frequent performer at the most important music festivals around the globe. He was awarded the prestigious Mozart Medal in 2015 and the UNICEF Medal of Honour in 1990 for his activities as pianist and conductor. His partner Vlada Vassilieva is winner of the 2010 Nadia Reisenberg piano award in New York City, among several other international piano competitions, and Fulbright Garcia Robles grantee during her graduate studies at Mannes College. Anatoly Zatin and Vlada Vassilieva work together not only as piano-duo but also as conductor-soloist team. They are members of the Petrof Art Family, of the International Academy of Performing Arts and Sciences, and of the International Piano Duo Association in Japan. They are proud ambassadors of Petrof Pianos worldwide.

Dear pianists around the world! Knowing your permanent interest in exploring new repertoire for piano duo, an interest that we enthusiastically share, we would like to introduce you to a hidden gem of Mexican music literature, a piece that has been in our repertoire for almost a decade now, and that we enjoy performing as much as our audiences enjoy listening to. Towards the mid-19th Century, Mexican cultured society shared a passion for the piano. The instrument became increasingly more popular since the culmination of the War of Independence (1821) and it was rare the home that would not own one. Amateur musicians abounded and many European professional artists made sure to include Mexico on the agenda of their international tours. The traditions of Salon Music quickly gained popularity and would remain for almost a full century. The establishment of the National

Conservatory of Music (1866) allowed many Mexican talents to pursue formal musical studies. The taste for salon piano pieces, from professional and amateurs, remained until the post-Revolutionary period. Successful examples of Mexican Salon Music are Felipe Villanueva (1862-1893), Ricardo Castro (1864-1907) and Juventino Rosas (1868-1894). Less known but of significant interest are the names of Ernesto Elorduy (1854-1913), Melesio Morales (1838-1908) and Tomás León (1826-1893). The latter, and the eldest in this group, played a fundamental role in two crucial moments for Mexican Music: the selection of the National Anthem and the founding of the National Conservatory of Music. By presenting at the 2021 World Piano Conference León's piano waltz "Laura", in our own concert arrangement for piano four-hands, we would like to invite concert pianists and piano teachers to explore the vast Mexican piano repertoire. Many scores and recordings can be freely found surfing the internet. We also invite you to read the interesting introduction written by Mtra. Guadalupe Lozada León, which will shed a brighter light on the live and work of Tomás León and his contemporaries. Finally, we express our deep gratitude to Mr. Eduardo Robles for introducing us to León's music in the first place, and for allowing us to share it with a broad audience in the context of this publication.



She won the Fukui Naoaki commemorative Scholarship, which is for outstanding students in the Musashino Academia Musicae in Tokyo, and obtained a Bachelor's degree in music there. In addition, she gained a Bachelor's degree in the liberal arts from the Open University of Japan. Having won the prestigious 'Gunma Artist Award for Studying Abroad' from her local government, she studied with K U Schnabel in Italy. Later, she achieved a high score in the ABRSM Exams. And the examiner, Mrs Eileen Field, offered her the chance to study in the UK. Rika was awarded an RCM Scholarship to enrol at the Royal College of Music, London, where she studied piano with Gordon Fergus-Thompson, and studied fortepiano with David Ward as her supplementary study. In 2001, she gained her Postgraduate Diploma in Performance with the Amadeus Fortepiano

Performing career - After completion of her study, she became very active, working for the "YAMAHA" Master Class" in Tokyo, a special course for very young, talented students. She has also cultivated a busy international performing career, performing piano solo and chamber music across Italy, Germany, Serbia and Taiwan. Since her first visit to Serbia in 2013, she has been promoting Serbian music and has often appeared in the Serbian Embassy, Tokyo. In recent years, Rika was honoured to appear at concerts such as the Japan-Serbia 135 years' Friendship Anniversary event in Serbian Embassy of Tokyo, Setagaya Museum Promenade Concert by the Setagaya Arts Foundation, and Evgenija Jeremic Soprano Recital organized by Fujimi City which is the sister city of Šabac City in Serbia. In June 2020 she was released a new music video "Serbian Dances" https://cheerforart.jp/detail/1100 in the Art project by Tokyo Prefecture.

As an organizer - Since 2008, Rika has been organizing numerous musical events in order to support young musicians, including the Y150 Piano Competition & Festival authorized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan. University of Northern Colorado (Greeley)







Unconventional Rhythmic Notations in the Haitian Méringue

Stylized compositions of the Haitian méringue for the piano exhibit unconventional rhythmic notations to indicate a more relaxed rendition of the cinquillo rhythm in Haitian salon méringues, which hybridized elements of European salon styles with rubato into the style of Haiti's national dance. Haitian composers devised the quintolet rhythm and special treatment of the 5/8 meter to set the relaxed five-beat syncopated rhythm with a slower syncopation than the cinquillo rhythm. These compositions also contain use of the Puerto Rican elastic tresillo rhythm, which also sets the five-beat syncopated rhythm with a relaxed syncopation. The five-beat syncopated rhythm embellishes the tresillo rhythm to add two notes in between each note of the tresillo rhythm. Though with the relaxed indication of these rhythms and meters, the embedded tresillo rhythm loses accuracy and requires correction against literal execution for the sake of the tresillo rhythm.

RIXIANG HUANG (CHINA)





Praised by the New York Concert Review as "in a word, superb," pianist Rixiang Huang has inspired glowing acclaim from audiences and critics alike for his superb artistry and passionate, charismatic performances on four continents. Since winning the first prize at the 12th Chopin International Piano Competition in Hartford and Los Angeles International Liszt Piano Competition in 2021, Huang has rapidly established for himself an international reputation. His first CD album, French Romance, released in April 2020, has already earned accolades from audiences and critics; Steinway Artist Rorianne Schrade remarked that his Debussy "reflect[ed] a special sensitivity, grace, and delicate tonal shading" and his Bartók "may be one of this listener's most enjoyable Bartók Sonata performances to date" (New York Concert Review). Winner of an impressive array of prizes, Huang was a top prizewinner of the Hastings International Piano Concerto Competition, Dallas International Piano Competition, New York International Artists Piano Competition, along with the Jacob Flier

International Piano Competition. He was also a semi-finalist in the prestigious Paloma O'Shea Santander International Piano Competition in 2018. Highlights of the 2020-21 season include a five city solo recital tour in China; solo recital at University of Southern California; chamber music performance at Sarasota Music Festival in Florida; and concerto performance with Chautauqua Symphony Orchestra. An immersive and versatile soloist, Huang has performed extensively all over the world in prestigious venues such as Carnegie Hall in New York, Alice Tully Hall at the Lincoln Center, Universität Mozarteum – Solitär in Austria; Santander Palacio de Festivales de Cantabria in Spain; Hamamatsu ACT Concert Hall in Japan; National Center for the Performing Arts and Beijing Concert Hall in China. His performances have been broadcast by WQXR-FM, Classic FM, Cleveland WCLV 104.9, Sarasota WSMR 89.1 & 103.9, and Corporación de Radio y Televisión Española.

Mr. Huang is represented by Creative Classical Concert Management. As an active soloist, Huang has appeared with leading orchestras around the world including Royal Philharmonic Orchestra in London; China National Symphony Orchestra; Indonesia National Symphony Orchestra; Chautaugua Symphony Orchestra in New York; and Eastern Music Festival Orchestra in North Carolina. He has also appeared as a guest artist with acclaimed string quartet Cuarteto Quiroga and was selected to participate in the Advanced Piano Trio Program by the acclaimed Kalichstein-Laredo-Robinson Trio. In addition, Huang has been a featured artist at Salzburg Summer Academy Mozarteum, Orford Music Academy, Bowdoin International Music Festival in Maine, Chautaugua Music Festival, Art of the Piano at the University of Cincinnati, Piano Texas, and Pianofest in the Hamptons. He has performed alongside preeminent conductors such as Jac Van Steen, Joel Smirnoff, Earl Lee, Eric Garcia, and has performed in master classes with Sergei Babayan, Stephen Hough, Arie Vardi, Veda Kaplinsky, Dimitry Alexeev, Pavel Gililov, among others. Huang is a DMA candidate and graduate teaching assistant at the USC Thornton School of Music, studying with prestigious conductor and pianist, Jeffrey Kahane. He is currently a member of MTNA (Music Teachers National Association). Huang received a Master of Music in Piano Performance at The Juilliard School, studying with legendary pianists, Jerome Lowenthal and Matti Raekallio. Previously, he worked with world renowned pianists, Antonio Pompa-Baldi and Paul Schenly at The Cleveland Institute of Music, where he was awarded the Arthur Loesser Memorial Prize for outstanding achievement in piano performance. 

Let's Dance: Diabelli, Beethoven, Carter Pann, and Two Hundred Years of a Viennese Waltz

In 1819 Anton Diabelli composed a Waltz and sent it to the most famous composers working in Vienna. Beethoven initially cast aside Diabelli's waltz, later writing his own set, Op. 120. Fifty composers responded to Diabelli's request, creating a second set of variations. The beloved Waltz theme is a

manifestation of Viennese culture. Furthermore, one can consider variation structure in light of social issues: as a formal procedure, variations are unified by their relationship to a theme, while at the same time embracing diversity. Suddenly, then, variations as art can express a model for social justice. To that end, in the spirit of Diabelli's innovative musical experiment, new variations have been commissioned. A performance of several of the new variations, including one by Pulitzer Prize Finalist Carter Pann, will be interwoven around discussions about creative compositional solutions, and what the new variations achieve as art reflecting society. Dr. Jensen-Abbott has now recorded a three-CD set of all three works, and her website, diabellisquared.com is running. lan Jones *FRCM* is Professor of Piano and Deputy Head of Keyboard at the Royal College of Music in London. In May 2014 Fellowship of the Royal College of Music was conferred on him by HRH Prince Charles. His career as a Steinway Artist has taken him to all five continents. Appearances with the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra and National Symphony Orchestra at London's Royal Festival Hall and Barbican Hall include critically acclaimed performances of Rachmaninov's Second and Third Piano Concertos and Paganini Rhapsody as well as concertos by Beethoven, Tchaikovsky, Grieg and Schumann. He has appeared in Paris and throughout France as concerto soloist with the Ensemble International and has performed many of Mozart's piano concertos in Europe and USA.

A prizewinner at the Leeds International Piano Competition, he also won many prizes, including the prestigious Chappell Medal, whilst a student at RCM. Other awards include the Vlado Perlemuter Piano Prize and a special scholarship from the French government inviting him to spend a year in Paris. His teachers included Maria Curcio, Gyorgy Sebok, Phyllis Sellick, Jerome Lowenthal and Alain Planès. He has broadcast for radio and television networks in many different countries and his World Première performances and recordings of music by British composer Rebecca Clarke (on Dutton Digital) have received much enthusiastic attention on radio and in the music press. In 2017 he discussed and performed Clarke's music on BBC Radio 3's Composer of the Week, in a week of programmes dedicated to her. On the recent release of his CD, Chopin: Summer in Nohant (London Independent Records), Classic FM magazine drew comparison with Rubinstein and Arrau and claimed that "Jones possesses the 'pearl' touch that marks out the finest Chopin exponents...his timing remains immaculate whatever the technical pressure." International Piano praised "some magically veiled sonorities and exquisite pianissimo...reminiscent of 1970s Pollini" and noted he "knows exactly how far to allow phrases room to dream and breathe before being gently reined back into focus." Gramophone praised his ability to "transform passages often treated as superficial rhetoric into something thoughtful and communing" and BBC Music Magazine described his playing as having "a lyrical elegance and unselfconscious purity of expression." He was piano coach, music advisor and composer/performer on the Oscar-nominated film Hilary and Jackie and has also written and performed music for France's two national theatres in Paris and Strasbourg. Ian Jones is much sought-after as a teacher and his students have enjoyed international success. He is Artistic Director of the World Piano Teachers Association International Piano Competition and often serves on the juries of other international piano competitions. He frequently examines and adjudicates at other leading conservatoires, including the Royal Academy of Music in London and regularly performs and conducts international masterclasses, most recently in China, Sweden, USA, Serbia, Japan, Ireland, Greece, Italy and Russia and at conservatoires such as Sweden's Royal College of Music and many keyboard faculties in USA. Since 2018 he has been Guest Artist at Virtuoso & Belcanto Music Festival in Lucca, Italy and at Gotland Chamber Music Festival, Sweden. In 2019 he was Guest Artist at Maestro Art Taiwan and Hainan International Piano Festival in China. In summer 2019 he joined the faculty of Amalfi Coast Music & Arts Festival, Oxford International Piano Festival and Chethams International Piano Summer School. ANNA KIJANOWSKA (POLAND)



Kijanowska's recording of The Complete Mazurkas by Szymanowski (Dux) was praised by Adrian Corleonis of Fanfare Magazine "as superior to any other interpretations that came before or after her" and received favorable reviews on both sides of the Atlantic from the *New York Times* and BBC Magazine. She holds a Doctorate and a Master of Music in Piano Performance from the Manhattan School of Music in New York, where she studied with Byron Janis. Lecture-Recital: History of the Mazurka and its Development Throughout the Centuries

The mazurka dance is a synthesis of polish folk music and it is considered to be a portrait of a polish soul. The mazurkowe rhythms, have been known since at least 15th century and in the 20th century one of the dances- Mazurek Dąbrowskiego- became the polish anthem. Mazurka was brought to the international stages by Fredric Chopin and developed farther by Karola Szymanowski, in the 20th century. Interestingly enough, the dances were already composed and popular before Chopin's birth and after Szymanowski's death. The Chopin's model of a mazurka, which is based on the lowland folk dances, was mixed with the Podhale folk music




from the Highland region of Poland by Szymanowski. The metric structure and character of the dances, is the major difference between the two types of the polish folk music. The three lowlands folk dances used by Chopin: mazur, kujawiak and oberek, are in triple meter, while góralski and zbójnicki folk dances are from the Highland region of Poland and they are almost exclusively in duple meter. The presentation will focus on the history of the mazurka and its characteristics, with a special emphasis on its development throughout the last two centuries by lesser known polish composers such as: Elsner, Damse, Kontski, Szymanowska, Badrzewska, Borkowski, Sawa and others.

An Examination of Genre and Pianistic Innovations in Ned Rorem's Eight Etudes

Ned Rorem, a Pulitzer Prize Winner, has written little piano solo music, though his main instrument as a performer is the piano. Most of this he composed during his early career, between 1948 and 1956. In 1975, he composed *Eight Etudes* for piano, in a radically different compositional style than his earlier piano solo music. The piece was commissioned by pianist Emanuel Ax, with a grant from the Edyth Bush Charitable Foundation, for the Bicentennial Piano Series of the Washington Performing Arts Society. Ax premiered the work at the Kennedy Center, in Washington, DC, on March 13, 1976. Rorem extends the genre of etude in this work, showing new piano idioms with free expression of his music ideas. He essentially translates the etude genre into a suite. In this lecture, I will explore the compositional style of Rorem's *Eight Etudes*, and how this style engages with the nineteenth- and twentieth-century traditions of the genre, with some attention to his earlier piano solo music.

DORIAN LELJAK (UK/CROATIA/SERBIA)

Dorian Leljak has won several international piano competitions, including the Rachmaninov Competition in Belgrade and the Novi Sad Piano Competition. He has been awarded numerous prizes, such as the University of Novi Sad Merit Award, Yale University Mary Clapp Howell, Irving Gilmore and Parisot prizes. Dorian enjoys a successful career worldwide as a pianist and chamber musician, having established collaborations with cellist Istvan Varga and pianist Ninoslav Zivkovic. In 2002 he made his debuts in Carnegie Hall and Boston Philharmonia Hall. After teaching piano at the Yale School of Music, he continued his tenure as Professor of Piano at the Academy of Arts in Novi Sad and as Piano professor at the Royal College of Music in London. Dorian has received pre-college music education in his native city of Zagreb in Croatia. Having graduated from University in Novi Sad under Professor Arbo Valdma, he pursued his doctoral degree in piano under Professor Boris Berman at Yale University. Dorian is Artistic Director of the

International Isidor Bajic Piano Competition, President of the World Piano Teachers Association (WPTA), the World Piano Conference (WPC) and the WPTA International Piano Competition, Honorary President of the European Piano Teachers Association (EPTA) - Voyvodina, as well as Executive Director of the Panopticum Musicum and Musica Ricercata International Music Schools. Dorian frequently presents masterclasses and lectures around the world and is invited to judge at many major international piano competitions including the Cleveland International Piano Competition, Top of the World Piano Competition Tromsø, Rome International Piano Competition, Santa Cecilia Competition Porto, Enschede International Piano Competition for Young Musicians, Fausto Zadra Competition and EWON Cheonan Competition in Seoul amongst others.



Lecture-Recital: George Crumb's Eine Kleine Mitternachtmusik (A Little Midnight Music)



In 2001, pianist Emanuele Arciuli commissioned a group of composers to write variations based on jazz musician Thelonius Monk's classic 'Round Midnight.' George Crumb (1929 -) expanded the project into an entire suite. Though the work opens and closes with literal statements of Monk's tune, from the very beginning, we know that the music is the incomparable work of George Crumb, with its strummed strings, full usage of resonant inside the piano, typically harmonic language of Crumb, and his hallmark in musical quotations. Crumb cleverly threw quotes from Debussy's Golliwog's Cakewalk, Wagner's Tristan, and Till Eulenspiegel's Merry Pranks by Richard Strauss. The work fuses jazz and Monk's theme with Crumb's harmonic language, but also interacts with European and American idioms and motifs.

CARMEL LIERTZ (AUSTRALIA)



Pianist and innovative educator, Carmel Liertz, is an international performance coach with an extensive background in Performance, Performance Education and Performance Research. Tertiary performance and pedagogy studies were undertaken in Australia and Germany. While teaching performance at university she became interested in applying sport psychology's mental training and sport nutrition principles to musicians' performance. Carmel created the first Performance Confidence Training Program for Musicians with her education thesis, 'Developing Performance Confidence: A Holistic Training Strategies Program for Managing Practice and Performance in Music'. The book / ebook 'Performance Confidence: A Training Program for Musicians followed (2009; 2012). In September 2021, her newebook 'Revolutionary Etudes: Experiencing Confidence with The Holistic Performance Model' was published. Liertz's signature 'Mind-Body Awareness' approach develops mind-body fitness and performance confidence simultaneously. This holistic approach also assists in recovery from burnout, chronic fatique, and physical injuries. Carmel Liertz specialises in personalised one-to-one coaching and workshops for performance confidence, self care and recovery. Among her research interests are Mind-Body Connections and Stress-Health-Performance Relationships.

PENG LIN (CHINA)






Chinese pianist Peng Lin is the first prize winner of 2012 Rhodes International Piano Competition. As the winner of the Juilliard School Mozart Concerto competition, she made her New York Lincoln Center debut in 2015 in Alice Tully Hall, with the Juilliard Orchestra under the baton of conductor Peter Oundjian. The third prize winner of the UK Open International Piano Competition 2020, Peng has garnered top honours at numerous international competitions, including the Bach Special Prize in the 2016 Rina Sala Gallo International Piano Competition, the second prize of the 2009 Louisiana International Piano Competition, and the third prize and Chopin Prize of the 8th International Competition for Young Pianists 'Arthur Rubinstein in Memoriam'. Peng Lin has performed throughout China, USA, Russia, Canada, Germany, Greece, Japan, Italy, Netherland, Poland, Switzerland, and the UK. She has been heard on stages of such prestigious venues as Carnegie Hall in New York, Muziekgebouw Hall in Amsterdam, Shanghai Concert Hall in Shanghai and The MusicHall in Dubai. An avid performer of both solo and chamber music, Peng has appeared in major music festivals. As an honoured

recipient of the 'New Horizon Fellowship', Peng regularly returned to Aspen Music Festival and Schools from 2011-2016. In the 2018 Taos Chamber Music Festival, she worked closely with members of renowned Borromeo Quartet, Miró Quartet and Brentano Quartet. During 2019 Sarasota Music Festival, Peng's live performance and interview were broadcasted on NPR and WQXR New York classical radio station. Peng Lin was born and raised on Gulangyu, "the piano island" in Xiamen, China. She began to play piano at the age of four and made her orchestral debut with Mozart Concerto K. 467 at the age of nine. She had won five top prizes in national piano competitions before moving to New York on a full scholarship to attend the Juilliard School Pre-College. Peng subsequently completed her Bachelor of Music and Master of Music degrees at the Juilliard School, under the tutelage of Yoheved Kaplinsky and Hung-Kuan Chen. In 2020, she received her Master of Musical Art degree from Yale School of Music where she studied with Hung-Kuan Chen and Peter Serkin. In 2021, Peng completed an Artist Diploma degree from the Royal College of Music in London, under tutelage of Dmitri Alexeev and Ian Jones.

Peng Lin is keen on contemporary music of both the east and the west. Her next project includes producing the first published recording of *Piano Concerto 'Gulangyu'* dedicated to her hometown, composed in 2006 by Chinese-Canadian composer An-lun Huang. Peng had previously premiered An-lun Huang's own piano transcription of his orchestra suite *Dream of Dun Huang*, inspired by Dun Huang Freso in the Northeastern China. She has also produced a recording of *Shandong Folk Suite* by Chinese composer Shi-Guang Cui. In the 2019/20 season, Peng commissioned and premiered a piano solo work *Nocturne: Spheres Align* by American-Swiss composer Anteo Fabris, which received the Rena Greenwald Memorial Prize at the Yale University. In addition to classical piano, Peng Lin is passionate about historical keyboard instruments. She studied harpsichord and virginal with Peter Sykes, clavichord with Masayuki Maki, and fortepiano with Audrey Axinn. At the New York Fortepiano Academy, she performed a range of styles from Bach to Brahms on various historical keyboards. Her live performance of Schubert Sonata D. 960 on a Broadwood fortepiano was featured on New York WIOX radio station.

Music Starter (Book Presentation): A New Method of Learning How to Read Music

Music Starter has been described as "A first-rate music tool that would greatly enhance the way we approach beginners' music instruction" (Dr. Dorian Leljak, WPTA President), "A wonderfully unique book with all the elements to ultimately instill a lifelong love of music!" (Dr. Maria Kotitsa, C



Psychol, Regent's College, London, UK), "One of the nicest and most significant achievements of our piano pedagogy" (Rita Kinka, Academy of Arts, Novi Sad). The book is designed to help children learn basic symbols of music notation through playing games (including stickers, cards, a board game, etc.), solving logic problems, reading stories, etc. It encourages children to *discover* the meaning of each symbol of music notation, enabling them to acquire elemental music literacy in a meaningful, creative, and exciting way. The tasks are carefully organized so that a child gradually moves from what is known to him/her towards the unknown. Mechanical repetition is avoided since each task in a lesson in unique, which helps children gain a more profound understanding of the concepts presented, while maintaining their concentration levels and interest in the book. With each problem solved and game finished, children take one step closer to understanding the essential music parameters and their symbols (rhythm, meter, pitch, registers, etc.).

MARIJA TIMOTIJEVIĆ (SERBIA)

Faculty of Philology and Arts, University of Kragujevac (Kragujevac)

Marija Timotijević was born on 18 September 1987 in Prokuplje. She graduated from the Faculty of Music in Belgrade where she also completed her Specialist studies in the class of prof. Jokut Mihailović at the piano department. She completed her Doctoral studies at the same faculty at the piano department in the class of prof. Dejan Sinadinović (2019). She won more than twenty 1st prizes at the republic and federal level (Republic Competition of Young Pianists in Belgrade, International Comptetition of Young Pianist in Niš, Festival of Music Youth in Šabac, Belgrade Chopin Fest, Competition of Music Schools "Josip Slavenski", Republic Competition of Music and Ballet Schools of Serbia, etc.) as well as prizes at international competitions: F. Chopin (Novi Sad), Nikolai Rubinstein (Paris), Pietra Ligure (Italy), International Competition "Davorin Jenko" (2013), and International Competition "Slobomir" (2013). She first performed with orchestra at the age of thirteen with the conductor Angel Šurev, and then in 2011 with the conductor Le Fi Fi (Vietnam) and the Niš Symphony Orchestra. She performed as a soloist and in ensemble at numerous concerts: Paris, Kopar, Vienna, Ljubljana, Budapest, Barcelona, Roma, etc. Besides soloist performances, she enjoys chamber music-making as well. She now teaches at the Faculty of Philology and Arts, University of Kragujevac, as an Assistant Professor at the piano department.

A New Light on Medtner's Piano Sonata Op. 5 No. 1

Piano Recital: N. Medtner - Piano Sonata F Minor, Op. 5 No. 1

N. Medtner's piano sonatas are hardly known among the public (and even musicians). The Medtner sonatas are highly original, containing formal designs, rhythms, and harmonies that are unique only to his compositional style. Medtner proved himself a master in his individual handling of the form; he caused no significant changes in its development, but his sonatas demonstrate one of the more outstanding uses of the form as an instrument for the expression of musical ideas. During a period when many composers either rejected sonata form or tried to find new principles to apply to the form, Medtner accepted the traditional structure. He observed the standard rules of sonata

form only as far as they coincided with the purpose and spirit of an individual sonata. The sonata in F minor exemplifies Medtner's consistently high plane of organization in his sonatas-intricate and complex, but always comprehensible. Medtner's first sonata is certainly exemplary of the composer's skilful handling of sonata form and the careful organization of his thematic material. It is of high aesthetic value and can now be used as a valuable stepping-stone to an evaluation of the later sonatas.

Agota Vitkay-Kucsera, PhD and DA, works as a full professor at the Academy of Arts, University of Novi Sad. She completed her master's studies at the aforementioned Academy in 2002 in the same class, and acquired the title of Master of Arts in 2010. She is engaged in pedagogical work, concert and opera singing, actively presents at Congresses and Conferences, conducts the professional seminars, she is involved in voice education of elite vocal professionals, and she is a member of numerous organizations. She is the author of the books:

Zvjezdan Vojvodić born 2003, Croatia, is a student of professor-advisor Ivanka Kordić at the Vatroslav Lisinski High School of Music in Zagreb. Zvjezdan is the winner of over 80 first and special awards at national and international competitions. On Croatian state competitions he won the first prizes for piano solo in 2015., 2017., 2019. and 2021. and for piano duo in 2016. and 2019. In 2015, 2016. and 2017. in Slovenia "Koroško piano competition" he won the first prizes and the special awards for the best performed musical pieces of classicism. In 2016. and 2019. in Belgrade, Serbia (Davorin Jenko competition) Zvjezdan was declared the competition laureate. In the year 2016, he also won first prizes in Hungary, "Danubia talents" and in Italy in Cortemilia, "Premio Vittoria Caffa Righetti". In 2017, Zvjezdan won first prizes on "Merci maestro" (Brussels, Belgium) and on International piano competition "Jurica Murai" (Varaždin, Croatia) where he was declared the competition laureate. In November 2017. he won 50th annual international piano competition "Virtuosi per musica di pianoforte" in Czech Republic, Ústí nad Labem, where he was declared the overall winner and won

several special prizes. As a laureate of that competition, he performed Chopin concert in f minor with North Bohemian Orchestra on the 51st competition opening ceremony in 2018. In December 2017, Zvjezdan won the first absolute prize on 12° Ars nova Trieste International Music Festival (Italy) and 2nd prize at the Cesar Franck piano competition in Kraainem, Belgium. In 2018 Zvjezdan won the first prize in "Isidor Bajić" piano competition in Novi Sad, Serbia. In 2019. in the EPTA competition in Croatia he has won first prize. He has performed as a soloist and as a member of a piano duo throughout Croatia and Europe. As a soloist, he has performed with the North Bohemian Orchestra in the Czech Republic and with the Karlovac Chamber Orchestra. Zvjezdan was declared as the best young musician in the 2019/20120 season in the cycle of concerts of young musicians organized by Jeunesses Musicales Croatia, Split, Croatia. In the period of restrictions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, from the autumn of 2020 he participates in online competitions in different age categories in different European countries. He won 17 first prizes and was even declared a laureate six times. Zvjezdan is the winner of two Oscars of knowledge from the Ministry of Science and Education in Croatia. From the school year 2020/21. he is a scholarship holder of the City of Zagreb for excellence.



SHANNON WETTSTEIN SADLER (USA)

St. Cloud State University (St. Cloud, Minnesota)

Shannon Wettstein, pianist, specializes in making connections between cutting-edge, experimental classical music and historical masterworks. With over 400 premieres as soloist and chamber musician, she has collaborated with composers such as Brian Ferneyhough, Chinary Ung, Jeffrey Mumford, Frederick Rzewski, and Martin Bresnick. Recent performances include the China-ASEAN Music Week, Costa Rica's Monteverde Institute, Nirmitta Composers Workshop, and the Sounds Modern series at the Ft. Worth Modern Museum. Shannon holds degrees from University of California, San Diego, New England Conservatory, and University of Kansas. Her teachers include Aleck Karis, Sequeira Costa, Stephen Drury, Richard Angeletti, and Claude Frank. She has received awards from the National Endowment for the Arts, US Artists International, Minnesota State Arts Council, and the American Composers Forum. She has 18 CDs available with music from Bach to Xenakis. Dr. Wettstein is piano faculty, St. Cloud State University.

Florence Price: Underrepresented Repertoire for Pianists of All Levels

Florence Price (1887-1953), the first significant African-American female composer, is known as the first African-American woman to have a work performed by a major American orchestra. Much of the music of Price is only recently becoming widely published and distributed, almost seventy years after her passing. Price's first composition was published when she was 11, and she continued to be a prolific composer throughout her life. This session explores her piano music from a pedagogical perspective. An experienced teacher of pianists from beginning through college levels, Price taught independently in Little Rock, Arkansas, following her graduation from New England Conservatory of Music, until she moved to Atlanta to become the head of the music department at Clark Atlanta University. After marriage, she returned to Little Rock, until racial tensions prompted the Price family to relocate to Chicago, where she flourished in her composition career, in spite of numerous obstacles. Many of Price's piano compositions reflect her experience and expertise with elementary and intermediate level pianists. This presentation focuses on how concepts of choreography, tone production, and musical texture run a through line between Price's works of all levels. This presentation illuminates how Price's elementary level pieces Etude and Three Sketches for Little Pianists specifically prepare students for her intermediate works Meditation, On a Quiet Lake, and Clouds, and likewise, these same elements of choreography, tone, and texture in the intermediate works prepare students to play her advanced level works the suite In the Land O'Cotton and Fantasie Negre No. 4.



PRZEMYSLAW WINNICKI (POLAND)

Przemyslaw Winnicki is an accomplished Polish pianist and prize winner of international piano competitions in Poland and abroad. He took second prize in International Piano Competition in Ischia - Italy in 2015. He is a Grand Prix Winner of the International COMPETITION for Music Teachers in Warsaw 2013. First Prize winner in "Chopin-Roma 2011" International Piano Competition. Finalist of the Moniuszko International Piano Competition in Minsk 2011. Finalist of the Yamaha Foundation Piano Competition in Poland, February 2011 and the Half-Finalist in the First Paderewski Piano Competition in Los Angeles in may 2010. Pianist took many prizes in Voice competitions for the best accompany and was also selected on other instruments competitions (cello, trumpet, saxophone) for an outstanding piano parts. He has performed as a soloist with many Orchestras: in Minsk with the National Belarusian Orchestra, in Reichenau (Austria) with the International Summer Academy Orchestra, and few in Poland: with Krakow, Rzeszow and Lodz Philharmonics. Recently in September 2014 he performed a Piano Concerto by P. Tchaikovsky with Opole Philharmonics in Poland. Pianist recorded CD with a Piano Concerto by Mozart, and made recordings for Polish RMF Classic. Since 2014 he is a member of KLER Foundation as one of the Scollarship holders. He performed many solo recitals in Poland and abroad: USA, France, Sweden, Spain, Italy, Germany, Belarus, Austria. Pianist has worked with worlds famous piano professors such as: Pascal Nemirovsky, Nina Tichman, Gottlieb Wallisch, Joaquin Soriano, Paul Gulda, Jan Gottlieb Jiracek, Katarzyna Popowa-Zydroń. Since January 2017, Pianist cooperates with SONORI ENSEMBLE, performing series of concerts.


ANNA YUKHO (BELARUS)

First Prize Winner of the Weatherford International Piano Competition in 2020, Anna received her first award at the age of ten as a winner of the International Chopin Piano Competition in Antonin, Poland. In 2003, she won Third Prize at the International Piano Competition "Music of Hope" in Gomel, Belarus. In 2009, she became a prize winner of the International Piano Competition in Memory of Arthur Rubinstein in Bydgoszcz, Poland. In 2015, she won the Pianist's Award of the ISA15 - International Summer Academy in Reichenau, Austria. In 2021, Anna won the honor to compete in the 21st Iturbi International Piano Competition in Valencia, Spain, where she was advanced to the semifinal round. During her career, Anna has

appeared at important venues such as Weill Recital Hall -Carnegie Hall and Klavierhaus in New York during the Mannes Sounds Festival, and Flagey Radio and Concert Hall in Belgium. Anna has participated in international festivals such as Vladimir's Spivakov's charity festival "Moscow Meets Friends", Pianofest in the Hamptons, and the International Keyboard Institute and Festival. She has also given performances in Belgium, Italy, Austria, Holland, Poland, and Russia. As a soloist, Anna has performed several times with the Belarusian State Chamber and Symphony Orchestra. Anna's numerous scholarships and awards include Tuition Scholarship from Mannes School of Music in New York, the Marian Marcus Wahl Memorial Award, the Woods Chandler Scholarship and the Henry & Lucy Moses Fellowship from the Yale School of Music, the Musical Club of Hartford Scholarship, and The Marilyn G. Lummis Prize from Rice University, Shepherd School of Music. Anna Yukho is currently studying with Dr. Robert Roux at the Shepherd School of Music at Rice University as an Artist Diploma candidate. From early childhood, Anna attended the Republican Gymnasium-College under the Belarusian State Academy of Music, a music school for gifted children, in her native Minsk, Belarus. In 2013, she graduated from the Belarusian State Academy of Music in Minsk where she studied with Professor Igor Olovnikov. Anna graduated with a Master's Degree from the Mannes School of Music in 2015 where she studied with Boris Berman and Peter Frankl.

MARKO ŽIVKOVIĆ (SERBIA)

Isidor Bajić Music School (Novi Sad)





Born October 2012 in Novi Sad, Serbia, Marko Živković learned to read very early, at the age of 2. He joined a preschool children's choir "Družiciranje" at the age of 3, where Professor Ana Kovačić and Professor Marija Đokić noticed his unusual interest in music theory. Individual piano lessons with Professor Milena Apić then followed from May 2017. He was 4 years old then. During this time, very often he played and explored music notation software on a smartphone and made more than 200 short music scores. At first it was child play, but later those scores and MIDI generated sounds from them, started to resonate like a true musical pieces. A composer Dorotea Vejnović helped him to further improve his talents by providing him some classes in that field. From the age of 6 he is officially student of Music School Isidor Bajić, mentored by of Professor Milena Apić. With his almost 9 years of age, he is currently attending classes in music theory with children aged 14 (6th grade of music school) and plays piano program made for 4th and 5th music school grade. His musical qualities include a perfect pitch and an an excellent perception of musical flow and phrases. Since October 2017 he made several public performances. This year he participated in a two piano contests and two composition contests and he won 1st prize in each. His vision is to become a great pianist and a composer.
